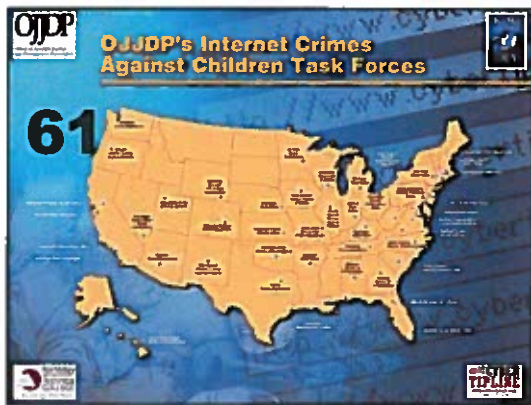

**Proactive Investigations**

- "A proactive investigation is designed to identify, investigate and prosecute offenders which may or may not involve a specific target, requires online interaction and a significant degree of pre-operative planning."\*

Sources include:

- Chat / Traveler
- Peer to Peer (P2P)
- Identity Takeover

**Proactive Investigations**

- **Traveler Investigation**
  - Online undercover investigation designed to identify, arrest, and prosecute those individuals who use technology to sexually solicit, meet, and consummate sex acts with children.
  - Commonly involves Internet chat, through e-mail and telephone use is not uncommon.

**Proactive Investigations**

- **Peer to Peer Investigation**
  - Online undercover investigation designed to identify, arrest, and prosecute those individuals who use P2P technologies to traffic images and movies of child pornography.

**Reactive Investigations**

- Reactive investigation involves the investigation of a complaint of a crime.
- Sources include:
  - Citizen complaints
  - CyberTipline
  - Referrals from ICAC Regional Task Force
  - Enterprise Cases
  - Assistance to other LE Units or Agencies
  - 'Knock & Talk' Interviews

- Report to local police instances of online child exploitation
  - Texts and social media

**Reactive Investigations**

Referrals from other ICAC Regional Task Forces

- Internet Crimes Against Children can begin in one jurisdiction and end in another.
  - Travelers
- Investigation may determine a suspect to be in another jurisdiction
  - Suspect moved, etc.
- Investigations forwarded to ICAC TF
  - Seamless follow-up
  - Same investigative standards, training

### Reactive Investigations

#### Assistance to other agencies

- Some agencies may lack the capacity to respond to Internet crimes against children
- Will call on expertise for assistance
  - Opportunity to assist and expand program reach



### Texting apps – Kik Messenger

- Kik lets kids text for free.
- Kik specializes in "promoted chats" – basically, conversations between brands and users.
- There's some stranger danger. - An app named OinkText, linked to Kik, allows communication with strangers who share their Kik usernames to find people to chat with
- There's also a Kik community blog where users can submit photos of themselves and screenshots of messages (sometimes displaying users' full names) to contests.

Texting apps - ooVoo

- ooVoo free video, voice, and messaging app.
- ▣ Users can have group chats with up to 12 people for free -- and it's common for kids to log on after school and keep it open while doing homework.
- ▣ You can only chat with approved friends.
- ▣ Only communicate with those on their approved contact lists, which can help ease parents' safety concerns.

Texting apps - WhatsApp

- WhatsApp lets users send text messages, audio messages, videos, and photos to one or many people with no message limits or fees.
- ▣ It's for users 16 and over. Lots of younger teens seem to be using the app, but this age minimum has been set by WhatsApp.
- ▣ It can be pushy. After you sign up, it automatically connects you to all the people in your address book who also are using WhatsApp. It also encourages you to add friends who haven't signed up yet.

Micro-Blogging Apps and Sites -- Instagram

- Users can snap, edit, and share photos and 15-second videos, either publicly or with a private network of followers. *It unites the most popular features of social media sites: sharing, seeing, and commenting on photos.*
  - ▣ Photos and videos shared on Instagram are public unless privacy settings are adjusted.
  - ▣ Private messaging is now an option. Instagram Direct allows users to send "private messages" to up to 15 mutual friends.

**Micro-Blogging Apps and Sites –  
Tumblr**

- Tumblr is like a cross between a blog and Twitter: It's a streaming scrapbook of text, photos, and/or videos and audio clips. Users create and follow short blogs, or "tumblelogs," that can be seen by anyone online (if made public).
- Many teens have tumblelogs for personal use: sharing photos, videos, musings, and things they find funny with their friends.

**Micro-Blogging Apps and Sites –  
Twitter**

- Twitter microblogging site that allows users to post brief, 140-character messages – called "tweets" – and follow other users' activities.
- Public tweets are the norm for teens. Though you can choose to keep your tweets private, most teens report having public accounts.
- Updates appear immediately. Even though you can remove tweets, your followers can still read what you wrote until it's gone.

**Micro-Blogging Apps and Sites –  
Vine**

- Vine lets users post and watch looping six-second video clips. This Twitter-owned service has developed a unique community of people who post videos that are often creative, funny, and sometimes thought-provoking.
- Teens usually use Vine to create and share videos of themselves and/or their friends and families.

### Self-destructing/Secret Apps – Burn Note

- **Burn Note** is a messaging app that erases messages after a set period of time. Unlike many other apps of this sort, it limits itself to text messages; users cannot send pictures or video.
  - It allows kids to communicate covertly. It may encourage risky sharing.
  - The company claims that its "Multi-Device Deletion" system can delete a message from anywhere: the device it was sent from, the device it was sent to, and its own servers.

### Self-destructing/Secret Apps – Snapchat

- **Snapchat** is a messaging app that lets users put a time limit on the pictures and videos they send before they disappear.
- Most teens use the app to share embarrassing photos without the risk of them going public.

• However, there are lots of opportunities to use it in other ways.

**Self-destructing/Secret Apps – Whisper**

- **Whisper** is a social "confessional" app that allows users to post whatever's on their minds, paired with an image. With all the emotions running through teens, anonymous outlets give them the freedom to share their feelings without fear of judgment.
- Whispers are often sexual in nature.
- Content can be dark.
- The app encourages users to exchange personal information in the "Meet Up" section.

**Self-destructing/Secret Apps – Yik Yak**

- **Yik Yak** is a free social-networking app that lets users post brief, Twitter-like comments to the 500 geographically nearest Yik Yak users.
- Kids can find out opinions, secrets, rumors, and more.
- Plus, all these have come from a 1.5-mile radius.
- This app has it all: cyberbullying, explicit sexual content, unintended location-sharing, and exposure to explicit information about drugs and alcohol.

**Chatting, Meeting, Dating Apps and Sites - MeetMe**

- **MeetMe Chat and Meet New People,** says it all. Although not marketed as a dating app, MeetMe does have a "Match" feature whereby users can "secretly admire" others, and its large user base means fast-paced communication and guaranteed attention.

**Chatting, Meeting, Dating Apps and Sites – Omegle**

- **Omegle** is a chat site (and app) that puts two strangers together in their choice of a text chat or video chat room.
- Being anonymous can be very attractive to teens, and Omegle provides a no-fuss opportunity to make connections. Its "interest boxes" also let users filter potential chat partners by shared interests.

**Chatting, Meeting, Dating Apps and Sites –  
Skout**

- Skout is a flirting app that allows users to sign up as teens or adults.
- They're then placed in the appropriate peer group, where they can post to a feed, comment on others' posts, add pictures, and chat.
- They'll get notifications when other users near their geographic area join, and they can search other areas by cashing in points.
- They receive notifications when someone "checks" them out but must pay points to see who it is.

- Tinder is a photo and messaging dating app for browsing pictures of potential matches within a certain-mile radius of the user's location. It's very popular with 20-somethings as a way to meet new people for casual or long-term relationships.

- It's location-based.
